**Usage:** This printable includes 5 pages.

**Page 2** – is the devotional that goes along with this activity

**Page 3** – is the “Who Am I” handout in a 8 x 11 size

**Page 4** – is a picture of the bunny for children to decorate in 8 x 11 size

**Page 5** – is the “Who Am I” and picture of a bunny on the same page.

Below are several possible ways to use the handouts:

- 1) **Cut page 5 in half in order to make a card. Use 1 sheet of cardstock per child. Fold the cardstock in half. Glue the “Who Am I?” page to the outside of the cardstock. Glue a headshot of the child to the bunny and allow the child to color/decorate the bunny with cotton balls and crayons/markers (they can do this while you read the devotional). You can also use pages 2-3 the same way, use a stapler, tape, or string to secure the pages together to make a card.**
- 2) **Do not cut page 5 in half. Glue a headshot of the child to the bunny and allow the child to color/decorate the bunny with cotton balls and crayons/markers (they can do this while you read the devotional). This makes a great gift for parents (just place it in a dollar picture frame)**

## Who is the Real the Easter Bunny!

### Devotional

Let's talk about the Easter Bunny so we can learn about who is the real Easter Bunny. Tell me, what do you think of when you hear the word "bunny"?

I'll bet you think of the ears. Ears are for what? Ears are for listening! That means that I take my time to listen to what other people have to say. James 1:19 says, "My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry."

What else do you notice about the Easter Bunny? What color is his fur? Is it white? What else is white as snow?

Isaiah 1:18 says, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow."

The white of the Easter bunny reminds us that our sins are forgiven and that we are cleansed.

Let's think about the pictures of the Easter Bunny. What does he look like? What kind of eyes does he have? Lots of Easter Bunnies have wide eyes. Why do you think that is? I don't know about you, but my eyes let me look at things. They let me see what is there, and see what is good and bad.

1 Thessalonians 5:21 says, "test them all; hold on to what is good." We have to look at what is facing us and choose wisely.

Do you hear anything from the Easter Bunny? Do rabbits make noise? No. Rabbits don't make a lot of noise. That means that they don't have a voice for complaining or arguing with others. Philippians 2:14 says, "Do everything without grumbling or arguing." You can be like the Easter Bunny by remember that you have no voice for whining or complaining.

What else do you know about rabbits? Are they rough? Do you think of them as being too energetic? No. Rabbits are gentle and kind. Ephesians 4:32 tells us "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Just like the Easter Bunny, remember that we are kind and gentle.

What do rabbits eat? Do they eat junk food? No! They eat plants. As a Christian, God feeds us, and it's up to us to eat what is spiritually good for us. The Word of God is food for our souls. That means that we grow strong and are fed by reading the Bible. We are also fed by praying and listening to God. It satisfies us and makes us grow as Christians. Psalm 119:11 says "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you." Like a rabbit, we must read and feed on the Word of God so that we might become strong.

Tell me what rabbits do? Do they walk? No. They hop. They hop here and they hop there. Well, my feet are like the Easter Bunny because they are ready to hop to in order to tell others about Jesus. My feet are ready to take the word to others. After Jesus rose from the dead he told his disciples: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Are your feet ready to hop across the world telling others about Jesus?

The Easter Bunny is a great way to celebrate Easter, but remember that you are the real Easter Bunny.

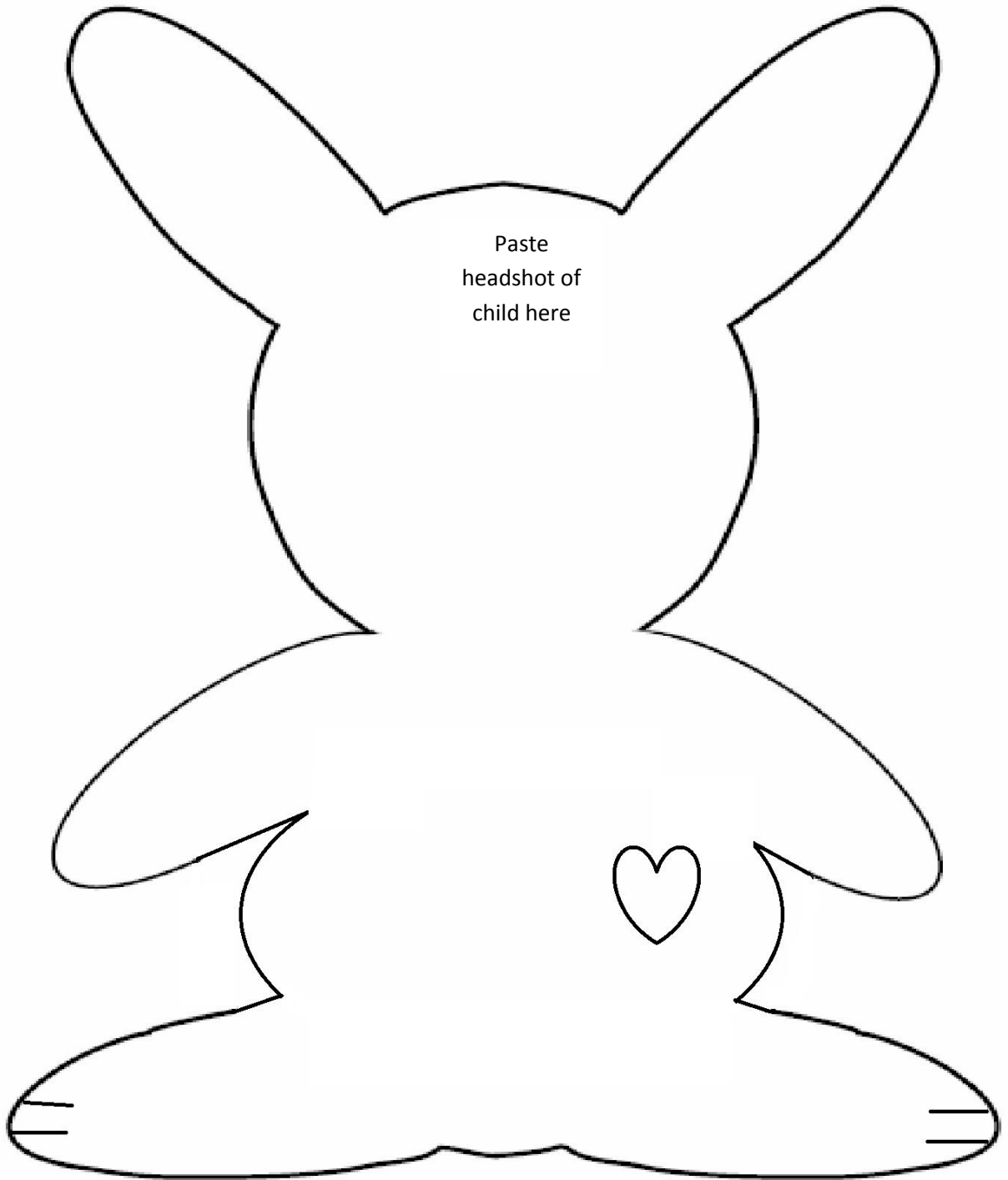
